- Our reporter in the pits told us that the Aston Martin team mechanics looked relaxed, sitting in comfortable chairs, sipping tea and eating biscuits.
- At 23:40 hrs the Audis looked to be in control, they occupied the first three places with No. 3 Champion Audi (Lehto) leading, No. 2 Champion Audi (Biela) second and No. 4 Audi Playstation Team Oreca Audi (Gounon) third. In LM GT2 the Porsches began to take control when the Panoz and Ferrari challenges faded away; Porsche occupied the first seven places at 23:45 hrs.
- The No. 61 Cirtek Ferrari 550 Maranello was running smoothly, sixth in class despite Vasiliev crossing the gravel traps at the Playstation Chicane just before he came into the pits.
- Martin Short and the No. 18 Rollcentre Dallara Judd were back running after their long pit stop trying to resolve power steering problems.
- Tom Kristensen was interviewed by French radio and he said: "We were surprised to lead the race so early on but helped by the misfortune of others, yes we are there. We are just trying to hang on, trying to do our best. It's very difficult, there are a lot of accidents and a lot of oil on the track we just have to stay out of trouble but the race is young we'll see."
- In LMP2 Liz Halliday was leading the class in the No. 32 Intersport Lola AER. This is her first visit to Le Mans, and so far it's been a rather rewarding experience for the young American.

• 00:20 hrs

- At just a minute past midnight, the No. 8 Rollcentre Dallara Nissan and the No. 17 Pescarolo Judd touched at the PlayStaton chicane bringing out yellow flags. The Dallara appeared to have a fire. Ayari took the Pescarolo back to the pits for inspection of the damage. At 00:16 it was still stationary in pit garage.
- Both Corvettes pitted together and No. 64 had a driver change.
- The No. 36 Belmondo Courage Ford was troubled with electrical gremlins. It was fitted with new plugs and battery.
- At 12:20 the 3rd placed No. 4 Audi Playstation Team Oreca Audi pitted. Gounon took over the car.

00:40 hrs

- As we moved into the small hours of Sunday morning, the No. 9 Team Jota-Zytek Engineering Zytek has quadruple-stinted. Dunlop is the only tyre manufacturer that had no punctures up to half past midnight.
- At 00:35, Lehto and Biela continued to hold control of the race in the No. 3 Champion Audi and No. 2 Champion Audi. There was only one lap between them and they were two laps ahead of No. 4 Audi Playstation Team Oreca Audi with Montagny at the wheel.
- No. 32 Intersport Lola AER was wheeled into the pit garage at 12:31 from leading position in LMP2. Liz Halliday was complaining of vibration in the car.

• 01:00 hrs

- The No. 9 Team Jota-Zytek Engineering Zytek went into its garage and was still there at 12:51am.
- Bosch tookover the No. 10 Racing for Holland Dome Judd after a brief visit to the pits with a rear wheel puncture. It rejoined, apparently the bodywork was not significantly damaged.
- The 14th-placed No. 17 Pescarolo Judd was given a stop and go penalty at 12:45am.
- Just before 01:00am Kaneishi took the No. 5 Jim Gainer International Dome-Mugen for a visit to the gravel at the Playstation chicane but rejoined undamaged.

01:20 hrs

- The Corvettes continued their habit of visiting the pitlane together. The No. 63 and 64 Corvette C6-R, again pitted at the same moment and both changed drivers. Magnussen got into No. 64 and Papis into No. 63.
- JJ Lehto brought in the race leading No. 3 Champion Audi at 1:08am for routine stop but experienced a slight delay while the front bodywork was properly secured.
- The puncture of the No. 10 Dome Judd was the first failure for a Dunlop after 8 hours of racing. The car was still in the pit garage at 1:12am.
- Mitchell took the No. 30 Kruse Motorsport Courage Judd and had for a spectacular spin into the gravel at the Dunlop chicane at 01:15am. The car appeared to be undamaged as it was extracted.
- The No. 10 Racing for Holland Dome Judd was still in the pit garage at 01:23am getting a new left side radiator.
- No. 18 Rollcentre Dallara Judd was in the pits at 01:21am for a driver change and new supply of power steering fluid. The power steering problems of the Dallara Judd are keeping Vanina Ickx from taking over. "You need to be a gorilla to drive it" said Martin Short.
- The No. 58 Aston Martin DBR9 continues to run well into the top 10, running 6th, only one lap behind No. 4 Audi Playstation Team Oreca Audi. The two Corvettes were also running in the top 10 in 8th and 9th positions at 01:28am. The No. 64 Corvette C6-R was just over a minute behind class leader the No. 58 Aston and closing the gap.
- No. 25 RML Lola MG was pushed into garage at 01:37am. After a brief pit lane application of tank tape, it appeared that the problem was a little more serious.
- The race for GT1 remained very close with the top 3 cars on the same lap at 01:40am
